Pre-Anesthetic Blood Testing Information and Consent Form

Like you, our greatest concern is the well-being of your pet. Before putting your pet under anesthesia, we will perform a physical examination and highly recommend a blood chemistry test. Blood chemistry tests provide information concerning your pet's vital organs and lets us know if they are functioning normally. These tests are especially important before any kind of surgery.

Our facility is fully equipped to run these tests on site and have the results available before any anesthesia is administered.

Please indicate your choice for pre-anesthetic blood testing below:

Pre-Anesthetic Blood Panel - \$110.26

This is a 6-count chemistry panel. This panel is generally used for animals **6 months to 2 years** of age. This panel includes ALKP and ALT (checks the liver), BUN and CREA (checks the kidneys), GLU (checks for diabetes), and TP (checks for healing abilities). This also includes a CBC (Complete Blood Count), which counts the various cell types in the blood and checks for evidence of infection or inflammation.

General Health Blood Panel -\$144.90

This is a 12-count chemistry panel. This panel is generally used for animals **2 to 6 years** of age. This panel includes ALKP, ALT, and TBIL (checks the liver), ALB and TP (checks for healing abilities), BUN, CREA, and PHOS (checks the kidneys), AMYL and CHOL (checks the digestive tract), GLU (checks for diabetes), and CA (checks calcium levels). This also includes a CBC (Complete Blood Count), which counts the various cell types in the blood and checks for evidence of infection or inflammation.

Comprehensive Blood Panel - \$177.60

This is a 12-count chemistry panel as well as a T4 panel (checks the thyroid) and a Lyte 4 panel (checks electrolytes.) This panel is generally used for animals **7 years and older**. This panel includes ALKP, ALT, and TBIL (checks the liver), ALB and TP (checks for healing abilities), BUN, CREA, and PHOS (checks the kidneys), AMYL and CHOL (checks the digestive tract), GLU (checks for diabetes), and CA (checks calcium levels). This also includes a CBC (Complete Blood Count), which counts the various cell types in the blood and checks for evidence of infection or inflammation.
